

## TO REGISTER A RESEARCHER CONTACT ON A RECORD IN THE 1901 CANADIAN CENSUS VIA AUTOMATEDGENEALOGY.COM

- 1) Once you have found your person or family of interest in the Automated Genealogy 1901 Canadian Census, scroll to the bottom of the census page on which they appear. Immediately below the transcribed records on each page will appear the following, with a hyperlink to click to register as a researcher. It is not necessary to be signed in as a volunteer to add a researcher contact.

- 2) The hyperlink will take you to a page that looks like the following. The drop-down menu is pre-populated with the records on each page by line number. Chose the record for which you wish to be listed then complete the personal information fields.

### Contact Information Form

Use this form to record your interest in contacting other researchers interested in an individual listed on this page of the census. Select a line/record from the page and then enter the email address at which you wish to be contacted.

**Please note:** adding yourself as a researcher contact makes your email address available on the web site and there is therefore the possibility that a visitor to the site will send you unwanted email. Your address will appear coded such that automated email collection programs are unlikely to pick it up but the possibility of receiving spam also exists. By registering as a contact you accept these possibilities.

While some researchers chose to add a contact for each listed member of a family on a census page, this is generally unnecessary. However if family members of interest appear on different pages then additional researcher contact notes are helpful.

- 3) Researcher contact information will be preserved and available at the bottom of the census page in the following format. The "More" hyperlink allows you to view all census entries flagged by a researcher.
