Immediately below the transcribed records on each page will appear the following, with a hyperlink to click to register as a researcher. It is not necessary to be signed in as a volunteer to add a researcher contact.

While some researchers chose to add a contact for each listed member of a family on a census page, this is generally unnecessarily. However if family members of interest appear on different pages then additional researcher contact notes are helpful.

3) Researcher contact information will be preserved and available at the bottom of the census page in the following format. The "More" hyperlink allows you to view all census entries flagged by a researcher.
